Hurrah! We're seniors! No new students! We are having a busy year: scrap drive, plays, yearbook, popcorn sales, pumpkin picking, magazine and card sales, chili supper, and oh, yes, our studies. May 9 we will be on our way to Washington, D. C., New York, and Canada for our last interesting experience as students of Lucerne School.

Bobby Sox

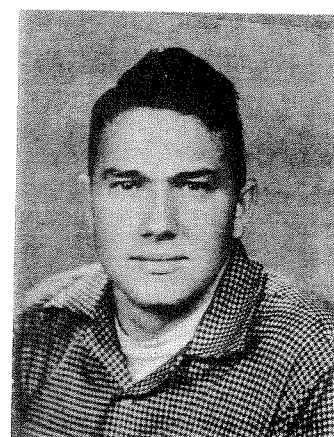
